
Cowal Gold Operations Open Pit Continuation Project, Lake Cowal, NSW (EPBC 2022/09223)

This decision is made under section 130(1) and 133(1) of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act). Note that section 134(1A) of the EPBC Act also applies to this approval. That provision provides, in general terms, that if the approval holder authorises another person to undertake any part of the Action, the approval holder must take all reasonable steps to ensure that the other person is informed of any conditions attached to this approval, and that the other person complies with any such conditions.

Annexure A

Note: Words and terms appearing in **bold** (excluding headings) have the meaning assigned to them at **Part C – Definitions**.

Part A – Avoidance, mitigation, and compensation conditions

CLEARING LIMITS

- 1) The approval holder must not:
 - a) Clear outside of the Action area.
 - b) Construct outside of the Action area.
- 2) To avoid and mitigate impacts to **protected matters** as a result of the Action, the approval holder must not **clear** more than:
 - a) 120.17 hectares (ha) of **Grey Box** (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) **Grassy Woodlands and Derived**Native Grasslands.
 - b) 11.11 hectares (ha) of Weeping Myall Woodlands.
 - c) 375.22 hectares (ha) of Australasian Bittern habitat.
 - d) 375.22 hectares (ha) of Australian Painted Snipe habitat.
 - e) 126.65 hectares (ha) of Painted Honeyeater habitat.
 - f) 606.98 hectares (ha) of **Superb Parrot habitat**.
 - g) 375.22 hectares (ha) of Latham's Snipe habitat.
 - h) 375.22 hectares (ha) of **Sharp-tailed sandpiper habitat**.
 - i) 375.22 hectares (ha) of Glossy Ibis habitat.

BIODIVERSITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

3) To avoid and mitigate impacts on protected matters as a result of the Action, the approval holder must comply with condition B48 of the NSW Approval, to the extent that it relates to protected matters.

- 4) The approval holder must commence implementing the Biodiversity Management Plan required by condition B48 of the NSW Approval, as approved by the NSW Planning Secretary, before the commencement of the Action and continue to implement the Biodiversity Management Plan required by condition B48 of the NSW Approval, as approved by the NSW Planning Secretary, until the completion of the Action.
- 5) The approval holder must comply with conditions B49 and B50 of the **NSW approval** to the extent they relate to **protected matters**.

OFFSETS

- 6) To compensate for the residual impacts to **protected matters** as a result of the Action, the approval holder must comply with conditions B43 to B44 inclusive of the **NSW Approval**, to the extent that they relate to **protected matters**.
- 7) Within 20 business days of receiving the receipt under the NSW BOS retiring the biodiversity credits as required by conditions B43 and B44 (inclusive) of the NSW Approval, the approval holder must submit written evidence to the department demonstrating that the biodiversity credits have been retired in accordance with the requirements of the NSW Approval.
- 8) Prior to **commencement of the Action**, the approval holder must secure under a NSW biodiversity stewardship agreement site of no less than 1438.2 hectares (comprising a combination of **PCTs 17**, **53 and 249**) of biodiversity offsets for the **Latham's Snipe**, **Glossy Ibis**, **Australian Painted Snipe**, **Australasian Bittern**, **Sharp-tailed sandpiper**.

Part B – Administrative conditions

PLAN REVISION

Note: Section 143A of the **EPBC Act** entitles the approval holder to apply for the **Minister**'s approval of a revised version of a **plan**.

- 9) The approval holder must notify the **department** within 20 **business days** of submitting any request to have a revised version of a **plan** approved by the **NSW Planning Secretary**. In this notification, the approval holder must provide the revised version of the **plan** to the **department** and specify the proposed changes. If a revised version of a **plan** is approved by the **NSW Planning Secretary**, within 20 **business days** of the revised **plan** being approved by the **NSW Planning Secretary**, the approval holder must provide the **department** with:
 - a) the version of the revised plan approved by the NSW Planning Secretary,
 - b) details of the comparison between the previous and most recently approved versions of the **plan**, describing all changes, and
 - c) a detailed discussion describing any changes to the harm, including impacts, to protected matters which will, or will likely, occur as a result of implementing the version of the revised plan approved by the NSW Planning Secretary.

Note: The above condition is not intended to limit the operation of section 143A of the EPBC Act.

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SUBMISSION AND PUBLICATION OF PLANS

- 10) The approval holder must submit all plans required by these conditions electronically to the department. This includes plans required under any conditions of the NSW Approval that are specified in these conditions.
- 11) Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the **Minister**, the approval holder must publish each **plan** on the **website** within 20 **business days** of the date the **plan** is approved by the **Minister** or by the **NSW Planning Secretary** as required under **NSW Approval** conditions which must be complied with in accordance with these **EPBC Act** approval conditions.
- 12) The approval holder must keep all **plans** required by these conditions published on the **website**, in a format that is easily accessible and downloadable, from the first date which that **plan** must be published and until the expiry date of this approval. This requirement applies to all current and superseded versions of **plans**.
- 13) The approval holder is required to exclude or redact **sensitive biodiversity data** from any version of a **plan** published on the **website** or otherwise provided to a member of the public. If **sensitive biodiversity data** is excluded or redacted from a **plan**, the approval holder must notify the **department** in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the **website**.

MODIFICATIONS TO STATE OR TERRITORY APPROVAL

- 14) The approval holder must notify the **department** in writing of any proposed change to the **NSW Approval** that relates to **protected matters** within 20 **business days** of formally proposing such a change and within 20 **business days** of becoming aware of any proposed change.
- 15) The approval holder must notify the **department** in writing of any change to the **NSW Approval** conditions that may relate to **protected matters**, within 20 **business days** of such a change to conditions coming into effect. Such notification must include a copy of the changed **NSW Approval** conditions showing what changes have been made.

COMMENCEMENT OF THE ACTION

- 16) The approval holder must notify the **department** electronically of the date of **commencement of the Action**, within 5 **business days** following **commencement of the Action**.
- 17) The approval holder must not **commence the Action** later than 5 years after the date of this approval decision.

COMPLIANCE RECORDS

- 18) The approval holder must maintain accurate and complete **compliance records** and document the procedure for recording and storing **compliance records**.
- 19) If the **department** makes a request in writing, the approval holder must provide electronic copies of **compliance records** to the **department** within the timeframe specified in the request.

- **Note: Compliance records** may be subject to audit by the **department**, or by an **independent auditor** in accordance with section 458 of the **EPBC Act**, and/or be used to verify compliance with the conditions. Summaries of the results of an audit may be published on the **department's website** or through the general media.
- 20) The approval holder must ensure that any **monitoring data**, surveys, maps, and other spatial and metadata required under the conditions of this approval are prepared in accordance with the *Guidelines for biological survey and mapped data*, Commonwealth of Australia 2018, or as otherwise specified by the **Minister** in writing.
- 21) The approval holder must ensure that any **monitoring data**, surveys, maps, and other spatial and metadata required under the conditions of this approval are prepared in accordance with the *Guide to providing maps and boundary data for EPBC Act projects*, Commonwealth of Australia 2021, or as otherwise specified by the **Minister** in writing.
- 22) The approval holder must submit all **monitoring data**, surveys, maps, other spatial and metadata and all species occurrence record data (sightings and evidence of presence) electronically to the **department** within 20 **business days** of the next anniversary of the date of this approval decision except where otherwise specified in a **plan**.

ANNUAL COMPLIANCE REPORTING

- 23) The approval holder must prepare a **compliance report** for each **Annual Compliance Report period** (ACR period).
- 24) The approval holder must ensure each **compliance report** includes:
 - a) accurate and complete details of compliance and any non-compliance with:
 - i) each condition imposed under the **NSW Approval**, if a condition attached to this approval decision requires compliance with that **NSW Approval** condition, and
 - ii) each condition attached to this approval decision, and
 - iii) all commitments made in each plan,
 - b) a schedule of all plans in effect in relation to these conditions during the ACR period,
 - accurate and complete details of how each plan was implemented during the ACR period,
 and
 - d) if any **incident** occurred, accurate and complete details of each **incident**.
- 25) The approval holder must ensure each **compliance report** is completed to the satisfaction of the **Minister** and is consistent with the *Annual Compliance Report Guidelines*, Commonwealth of Australia 2023.
- 26) The approval holder must, within 20 **business days** following the end of each **ACR period**, in a format that is easily accessible and downloadable, publish on the **website**:
 - a) each **compliance report**, and

- b) a **shapefile** showing all **clearing** of **protected matters**, and their habitat, undertaken within the **ACR period**.
- 27) The approval holder must:
 - a) Exclude or redact **sensitive biodiversity data** from each **compliance report** and **shapefile** published on the **website** or otherwise provided to a member of the public.
 - b) If sensitive biodiversity data is excluded or redacted from a version of a compliance report published or otherwise provided to a member of the public, submit the full compliance report to the department within 20 business days of its publication on the website and notify the department in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the website or otherwise provided to a member of the public.
 - c) If sensitive biodiversity data is excluded or redacted from a version of a shapefile published or otherwise provided to a member of the public, submit the full shapefile to the department within 20 business days of its publication on the website and notify the department in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the website or otherwise provided to a member of the public.
- 28) The approval holder must notify the **department** electronically, within 20 **business days** of each date of publication that the **compliance report** has been published on the **website**. In this notification, the approval holder must provide the **department** with the web address for where the **compliance report** and related **shapefile** are published on the **website**.
- 29) The approval holder must keep each **compliance report** and related **shapefile** published on the **website** from the first date which that **compliance report** must be published and until the expiry date of this approval.

Note: Compliance reports may be published on the department's website.

REPORTING NON-COMPLIANCE

- 30) The approval holder must notify the **department** electronically, within 2 **business days** of becoming aware of any **incident**. The approval holder must specify in each notification:
 - a) any condition or commitment made in a **plan** which has not been, or may have not been, complied with,
 - b) a short description of the incident, and
 - the location (if applicable, including co-ordinates), date and time of the incident.
- 31) The approval holder must provide to the **department** in writing, within 20 **business days** of becoming aware of an **incident**, the details of that **incident**. The approval holder must specify:
 - a) all corrective measures and investigations which the approval holder has already taken in respect of the **incident**,
 - b) the potential impacts of the incident,

- c) the method and timing of any corrective measures that the approval holder proposes to undertake to address the **incident**, and
- d) any variation of these conditions or revision of a **plan** that will be required to prevent recurrence of the **incident** and/or to address its consequences.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT

- 32) The approval holder must ensure that an **independent audit** of compliance with the conditions is conducted for every **audit period**.
- 33) The approval holder must submit details of the proposed **independent auditor** and their qualifications to the **department** within 20 **business days** following the end of each **audit period**.
- 34) The approval holder must ensure the scope of each **independent audit** is sufficient to determine the compliance status for each condition of approval, and each commitment made in each **plan**.
- 35) The approval holder must ensure the criteria for each **independent audit** and the undertaking of each **independent audit** are consistent with the **Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines**.
- 36) The approval holder must submit an **audit report** to the **department** for written agreement from the **department** within 3 months following the end of each **audit period**, or as otherwise directed by the **Minister** in writing.
- 37) The approval holder must ensure each audit report is completed to the satisfaction of the Minister and is consistent with the Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines to the extent that the Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines are consistent with these conditions.
- 38) The approval holder must publish each **audit report** on the **website**, in a format that is easily accessible and downloadable, within 20 **business days** of the date the **department** agrees to that **audit report** in writing.
- 39) The approval holder must notify the **department** within 20 **business days** of the date the **audit report** is published on the **website**. In this notification, the approval holder must provide the **department** with the web address for where the **audit report** is published on the **website**.
- 40) The approval holder must keep each **audit report** published on the **website** from the first date which that **audit report** must be published and until the expiry date of this approval.

COMPLETION OF THE ACTION

41) Within 20 business days after the completion of the Action, and, in any event, at least 20 business days prior to the expiry date of this approval, the approval holder must notify the department electronically of the date of completion of the Action and provide completion data. The approval holder must submit any spatial data that comprises completion data as a shapefile.

42) The approval holder must notify the **department** electronically at least 60, but not more than 70, **business days** prior to the expiry date of this approval, that the approval is due to expire.

Note: Section 145C of the **EPBC Act** entitles the approval holder to request an extension to the period of effect of this approval.

Part C - Definitions

Words and terms appearing in **bold** (excluding headings) have the meaning assigned to them in the list below:

Action area means the location of the Action, represented in <u>Attachment A</u> by the zone enclosed by the black line designated 'Action area' in the Legend excluding the grey shaded zones designated 'Existing and approved disturbance area' in the Legend.

Annual Compliance Report period or **ACR period** means each subsequent 12-month period following the date of this approval decision until the expiry date of this approval, unless otherwise specified in writing by the **Minister**.

Audit period means each subsequent five-year period following the **commencement of the Action** until the expiry date of this approval unless otherwise specified in writing by the **Minister**.

Audit report means a written report of an independent audit.

Australasian Bittern means the EPBC Act listed threatened species Botaurus poiciloptilus.

Australasian Bittern habitat means any area which provides habitat for the **Australasian Bittern.** Within the **Action area**, the extent of known **Australasian Bittern habitat** is represented in <u>Attachment D</u> by the zone shaded light blue and designated 'Australasian Bittern (*Botaurus poiciloptilus*) habitat (Endangered)' in the Legend.

Australian Painted Snipe means the EPBC Act listed threatened species Rostratula australis

Australian Painted Snipe habitat means any area which provides habitat for the **Australian Painted Snipe**. Within the **Action area**, the extent of known **Australian Painted Snipe habitat** is represented in Attachment H by the zone shaded light blue designated "Australian Painted Snipe (*Rostratula australis*) habitat (Endangered)" in the Legend.

Biodiversity credits means the unit of measure for offsets in accordance with the Biodiversity Offsets Scheme under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (NSW).

Biodiversity data means 'biodiversity data' as described in the *Policy on Accessing and Sharing Biodiversity Data*, Commonwealth of Australia 2024.

Business day means a day that is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or a public holiday in New South Wales

Clear, cleared or **clearing** means the cutting down, felling, thinning, logging, removing, killing, destroying, poisoning, ringbarking, uprooting, or burning of vegetation not including any weed or fire management specified in a **plan**.

Commence the Action or **commences the Action** means the first instance of any on-site **clearing, construction** or other physical activity associated with the Action, but does not include minor physical disturbance necessary to:

- Undertake pre-clearance surveys or monitoring programs.
- Install signage and/or temporary fencing to prevent unapproved use of the Action area, so long as the signage and/or temporary fencing is located where it does not harm any protected matter.
- Protect environmental and property assets from fire, weeds, and feral animals, including use of existing surface access tracks.
- Install temporary site facilities for persons undertaking pre-commencement activities so long as these facilities are located where they do not harm any protected matter.
- Undertake soil sampling or geotechnical investigations provided these cause only minor physical disturbance, will not **harm** any protected matter and are required in advance of commencement of site works.
- Previous activities approved under the EPBC Act.
- Previous activities approved under the EPBC Act, including the carrying out of activities approved under EPBC Approval 2017/7989.

Commencement of the Action means the date on which the approval holder **commences the Action**.

Completion data means an environmental report and spatial data clearly detailing how the conditions of this approval have been met.

Completion of the Action means the date on which all activities associated with the approved Action, other than those which provide compensation for the impacts of the Action, have permanently ceased and/or been completed.

Compliance records means all documentation or other material in whatever form required to demonstrate compliance with these conditions of approval (including compliance with commitments made in **plans**) in the approval holder's possession, or that are within the approval holder's power to obtain lawfully.

Compliance report means a written report of compliance with, and fulfilment of, these conditions (including compliance with commitments made in **plans**).

Construct, Construction means:

- the erection of a building or structure that is, or is to be, fixed to the ground and wholly or partially fabricated on-site,
- the alteration, maintenance, repair or demolition of any building or structure,
- any work which involves breaking of the ground (including pile driving) or bulk earthworks,
- the laying of pipes and other prefabricated materials in the ground, and
- any associated excavation work.

Construct/Construction does not include the installation of temporary fences or signage or other activities specified as exceptions to the definition of **Commence the Action**.

Department means the Australian Government agency responsible for administering the **EPBC Act**.

EPBC Act means the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cth).

Glossy Ibis means the EPBC Act listed Migratory species Plegadis falcinellus.

Glossy Ibis habitat means any area which provides habitat for the Glossy Ibis. Within the Action area, the extent of known Glossy Ibis habitat is represented in Attachment G by the light ochre shaded zone designated 'Glossy Ibis (*Plegadis falcinellus*) habitat (Migratory)' in the Legend.

Grey Box (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands means the EPBC Act listed threatened ecological community Grey Box (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands of South-Eastern Australia. The location of Grey Box (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) Grassy Woodlands identified within the Action area is represented in Attachment B by the dark ochre shaded zones designated 'Grey Box (*Eucalyptus microcarpa*) Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands of South-Eastern Australia (Endangered)' in the Legend.

Harm means to cause any measurable direct or indirect disturbance or deleterious change as a result of any activity associated with the Action.

Incident means any:

- event which has the potential to, or does, harm any protected matter,
- potential non-compliance with these conditions, including the administrative requirements,
- actual non-compliance with these conditions, including the administrative requirements,
- potential non-compliance with one or more commitment made in a plan, and/or
- actual non-compliance with one or more commitment made in a plan.

Independent audit means an audit, conducted by an **independent auditor**, of compliance with and fulfilment of these conditions and the commitments made in **plans**, objectively evaluated against the audit criteria developed by the **independent auditor**, in accordance with the **Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines** to the extent that the **Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines** are consistent with these conditions.

Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines means the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines,*Commonwealth of Australia 2019.

Independent auditor means a person, or firm, who:

- does not have any individual, financial*, employment* or family affiliation or any conflicting interests with the Action, the approval holder or the approval holder's staff, representatives, or associated persons,
- has demonstrated experience in undertaking government-regulated environmental compliance audits, and
- holds relevant professional qualifications and accreditations.

Latham's Snipe means the EPBC Act listed Migratory species Gallinago hardwickii

Latham's Snipe habitat means any area which provides habitat for the **Latham's Snipe.** Within the **Action area,** the extent of known **Latham's Snipe habitat** is represented in <u>Attachment E</u> by the zone shaded deep purple designated 'Latham's Snipe (*Gallinago hardwickii*) habitat (Migratory)' in the Legend.

Minister means the Australian Government Minister administering the **EPBC Act**, including any delegate thereof.

Monitoring data means the data required to be recorded under the conditions of this approval, including **sensitive biodiversity data**.

NSW Approval means the development consent granted for the Cowal Gold Operations Open Pit Continuation Project (SSD- 42917792) by the **NSW Planning Secretary** under section 4.39 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act* 1979 (NSW) on 10 December 2024. At the time of this approval, the **NSW Approval** can be accessed on the NSW Major Projects **website** via the following webpage address: <u>Cowal Gold Operations Open Pit Continuation | Planning Portal - Department of Planning and Environment</u>

NSW Planning Secretary means the Planning Secretary as defined in the **NSW Approval**.

Painted Honeyeater means the EPBC Act listed threatened species Grantiella picta.

Painted Honeyeater habitat means any area which provides habitat for the Painted Honeyeater. Within the Action area, the extent of known Painted Honeyeater habitat is

represented in <u>Attachment I</u> by the zones shaded light purple and designated 'Painted honeyeater (*Grantiella picta*) habitat (Vulnerable)' in the Legend.

PCT 17 means the ecological community as defined in condition B45 of the **NSW Approval**, Lignum shrubland wetland of the semi-arid (warm) plains (mainly Riverina Bioregion and Murray Darling Depression Bioregion).

PCT 53 means the ecological community as defined in condition B45 of the **NSW Approval**, Shallow freshwater wetland sedgeland in depressions on floodplains on inland alluvial plains and floodplains.

PCT 249 means the ecological community as defined in condition B45 of the **NSW Approval**, River Red Gum swampy woodland wetland on cowals (lakes) and associated flood channels in central NSW

Plan means any biodiversity management plan or strategy that the approval holder is required by these conditions to implement.

Protected matter(s) means a matter protected under a controlling provision in Part 3 of the **EPBC Act** for which this approval has effect.

Retire, Retired, Retiring means to retire **biodiversity credits** in accordance with the Biodiversity Offset Scheme under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (NSW).

Sensitive biodiversity data means **biodiversity data** which, if released, published or otherwise exposed, may result in **harm** to the relevant **protected matter** as a result of the intentional or unintentional misuse of that **biodiversity data**.

Sharp-tailed sandpiper means the **EPBC Act** listed Migratory species *Calidris acuminata*.

Sharp-tailed sandpiper habitat means any area which provides habitat for the **Sharp-tailed sandpiper**. Within the **Action area**, the extent of known **Sharp-tailed sandpiper habitat** is represented in <u>Attachment F</u> by the zone shaded dark red designated 'Sharp-tailed sandpiper (*Calidris acuminata*) habitat (Migratory)' in the Legend.

Shapefile means location and attribute information about the Action provided in an Esri shapefile format containing:

- '.shp', '.shx', '.dbf' files,
- a '.prj' file which specifies the projection or geographic coordinate system used, and
- an '.xml' metadata file that describes the shapefile for discovery and identification purposes.

Superb Parrot means the EPBC Act listed threatened species Polytelis swainsonii.


Superb Parrot habitat means any area which provides habitat for the **Superb Parrot.** Within the **Action area**, the extent of known **Superb Parrot habitat** is represented in <u>Attachment J</u> by the

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zones shaded orange designated 'Superb Parrot (*Polytelis swainsonii*) habitat (Vulnerable)' in the Legend.


Website means a set of related web pages located under a single domain name attributed to the approval holder and available to the public.

Weeping Myall Woodlands means the EPBC Act listed threatened ecological community Weeping Myall Open Woodland of the Darling Riverine Plains and Brigalow Belt South Bioregions. 


A: Action Area




B: Grey Box Impact




C: Weeping Myall Impact




D: Australasian Bittern Impact



E: Latham's Snipe Impact




F: Sharp-tailed Sandpiper Impact




G: Glossy Ibis Impact
