

# A message from our General Manager

Welcome to the July 2025 Ernest Henry Update

Hello once again. It's great to see the weather cool down and event season kick into gear in the North West. As I write this, the Cloncurry Show has just wrapped up-and what a great event it was! We're always grateful for the chance to be part of something that brings the community together, and this year was no exception. As a self-confessed petrolhead, the Show & Shine competition was a personal highlight. A big congratulations to Johnny Williams, who took out first place with his red Ford Fairlane—what a beauty! Hats off as well to all the other passionate competitors who made the event so memorable. A special shoutout to our own Erin Savage, Mine Technical Services Manager, who relocated to Cloncurry last year and took out a number of ribbons in this year's sections. Well done to all.

At Ernest Henry we are now firmly in the midst of work to deliver our mine extension out to 2040. Over the winter we will commission a ventilation upgrade which increases the amount of fresh air available in the mine, with a refrigeration plant to cool this air due to come online in the spring.

We are working through the preparations for an amendment to our Environmental Approval that will

be required to proceed with this extension. Once the technical work is completed this will be released for public consultation, which will give you the opportunity to review the application.

We have also started mining below our current underground crusher, which has necessitated a change in how we operate. A significant portion of our ore must now be trucked to the crusher, requiring an increase in our fleet. Where we previously ran a fleet of three trucks we now have six and will increase to ten in the coming years.

As operations expand and new equipment is introduced, we'll be looking for additional team members to help us operate and maintain it. That means plenty of new employment opportunities are on the horizon at Ernest Henry.

Evolution Mining is proud to support the future of emergency medical services in North West Queensland through a partnership with LifeFlight. As part of our commitment, we are contributing \$155,000 towards the installation of a state-of-the-art gantry crane at LifeFlight's new Mount Isa base.

Construction of the new LifeFlight Mount Isa Base is progressing well, with completion expected by late November 2025. Once operational, the base will house a new AW139 helicopter, offering superior speed, range, and performance compared to the previous BK117 model. Capable of covering approximately 500 km in just two hours, the AW139 will significantly enhance LifeFlight's ability to deliver critical care when every minute counts.

The gantry crane funded through this partnership will allow LifeFlight to perform essential maintenance onsite—eliminating the need to return to Brisbane. This means reduced downtime, increased efficiency, and more time spent serving the communities of North West Queensland.

In addition, we're supporting lifesaving education with an annual contribution of \$50,000 over the next three years to help deliver the First Minutes Matter Training program throughout North West Queensland. This vital initiative is set to launch in July, equipping locals with the skills to respond effectively in emergency situations.
